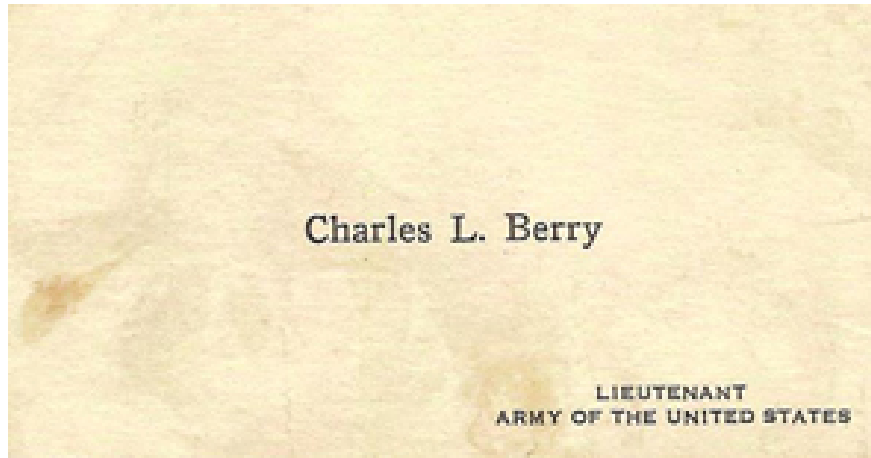


## AN INTERNET CONNECTION

*It was recalled by Deirdre that the American billeted on the house was killed after the D-Day Normandy landings but that was all that was known of him until the calling card came to light and an Internet search was made.*
