



### **1938 MAMARONECK HIGH SCHOOL TRACK TEAM**

**Richard J. Shea (middle row, center) was on the 1938 MHS track team with three other Kemper Park Honorees. David Anderson (middle row, far left) was a B-24 pilot and his plane crashed in Austria on July 26, 1944. John Morrissey (top row) was killed on the Remagen Bridge in Germany on March 11, 1945, and Richard Knight, a B-24 navigator (bottom row), was on a plane that went missing on December 18, 1944, while on a mercy mission in Yugoslavia.**

**Electrician's Mate 3cl Shea was serving on the USS Mindanao, a Yangtze River gunboat, and on his way to the Philippines on December 7, 1941. The Mindanao patrolled Manila Bay until May 4, 1942, when it was deliberately sunk to prevent its capture and use by the Japanese. Along with his crewmates, Shea then took over the artillery guns at Fort Hughes on Caballo Island. He was killed by a bomb splinter on May 6, 1942. Shea's body was never found and he is listed on the Tablets of the Missing at the Manila American Cemetery.**
