Dear Mrs. Berry:

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. 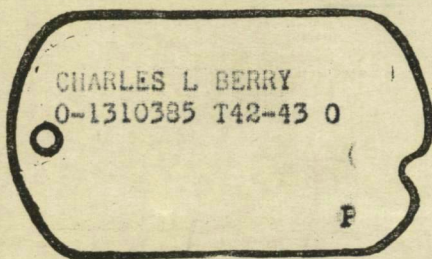
