Stationed in England with an Infantry Division since January, Lt. Berry enlisted in July, 1942, and was commissioned at Fort Ben-



A former resident of Clifton Park, Lakewood, Ohio, Lt. Berry was graduated from Lakewood High School and from Dartmouth College, Class of 1935. He was a member of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity. Prior to entering the service, he was associated with Montgomery-Ward in New York City. His last letter home was dated June 5, the day before D-day.
