





I, EDWARD A. BARTOLINA, Captain, Air Corps, 0318227, Army Air Force Redistribution Station No. 4, Santa Ana Army Air Base, Santa Ana, California, do hereby certify that:

1. I was the Summary Court Officer appointed to take charge of the personal effects of Captain Warner Marshall, Jr., when the said Captain Marshall met his death while on a tour of inspection of the China-Burma-India Theatre Command. At that time I was stationed at APO 885, c/o Postmaster, New York City, New York. The death of Captain Marshall occurred as a result of an airplane accident at Laminirhat, India, which place is some distance from the above APO 885. Captain Marshall, however, had made his headquarters at the place where I was stationed. Upon receipt of the personal effects of Captain Marshall, which were listed on WDAGO Form 54, attached to this file, I listed said effects upon the said form, and, in addition, I visited the personal quarters of Captain Marshall at the said APO 885, where I found nothing further to add to the effects. The effects received at headquarters were sent there from the point of the crash. I do not know who collected the personal effects of Captain Marshall at the point of the crash, but will state, specifically, that the only articles or personal effects received by me as Summary Court Officer are those listed on WDAGO Form 54. I did not find a wrist watch of any description in the effects of Captain Marshall which were received by me, nor did I find a wrist watch of any description when I visited his personal quarters at the said APO 885. I further wish to state that no wrist watch of Captain Marshall's ever came into my possession.





Gentlemen:

Captain Warner Marshall, Jr. (0-909665) of this division was killed in an airplane accident at Laminirhat, India, on December 12, 1943, while on a tour of inspection of that theater following his attendance at the Cairo conference.

Captain Marshall was my assistant and my close personal friend, and I have been delegated as the officer to supervise the disposal of his effects.

I have recently returned from a tour of the China-Burma-India theater and learned from General Stratemeyer, and others of General Stratemeyer's staff who were acquainted with the details of Captain Marshall's death, that while most of his effects were destroyed in the fire which followed the crash of the plane, certain personal belongings were salvaged and forwarded to you for distribution. As I understand it, the items forwarded to you were Captain Marshall's silver cigarette case, (given by me to Captain Marshall), a wrist watch, and a silver wristlet identification badge. I further understand that these showed severe evidence of damage from fire and I would like to have all possible traces of this removed before these effects are forwarded to Captain Marshall's widow, Mrs. Warner Marshall, Jr., 1701 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, Washington, D. C.

May I therefore request that you forward these articles to me at the above address, as the officer in charge of Captain Marshall's effects, and I will send them to a firstclass jeweler for refurbishing before they are passed on to Mrs. Marshall. I have discussed this procedure with Captain Marshall's brother, the Reverend Malcolm Marshall, of the National Episcopal Cathedral here, and he entirely approves of what is proposed.

I will appreciate advices from you in this matter at your earliest convenience.


