

Capt. Marshall Honored After Death In India

News has been received here of the posthumous award of the Legion of Merit to the late Capt. Warner Marshall, Jr., formerly a resident of 12 Seton Road, Larchmont, who was killed Dec. 12 in a plane crash in the Assam Valley of Northeastern India.

The award has been made "for distinguished work as a member of the Planning Staff of the American Air Forces."

Capt. Marshall, who was 32 years old, was aboard a troop carrier transport plane having participated in an inter-allied conference in Cairo and was making an official Army tour of the India-Burma-China theater of war when the crash occurred.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Warner Marshall are now residents of Tuscon, Ariz. He is also survived by two brothers, the Rev. Malcolm Marshall of St. Albans Parish in Washington, D. C., whose wife is the former Ellen Russell of Larchmont, and Pvt. Gordon Marshall, stationed with the United States Army at San Luis Obispo, Calif. His aunt, Mrs. A. F. Beringer, resides at 909 Fenimore Road, Mamaroneck.
