News has been received here of the posthumous award of the Legion of Merit to the late Capt. Warner Marshall, Jr., formerly a resident of 12 Seton Road, Larchmont, who was killed Dec. 12 in a plane crash in the Assam Valley of Northeastern India.

The award has been made "for distinguished work as a member of the Pianning Staff of the American Air Forces."
