Larchmont Man Dies In India Crash

**Capt. Warner Marshall,
Jr., Killed In Plane
While On War Tour**

RESIDENT 14 YEARS

Capt. Warner Marshall, Jr., of the United States Army Air Forces was killed Dec. 12 in an airplane crash in northeast India, according to word received here today. The son of Mr. and Mrs. Warner Marshall of New York and Tucson, Ariz., he was a resident of 12 Seton Road, Larchmont, for 14 years. He was a nephew of Mrs. Albert F. Berlinger of 219 Rockingstone Avenue.

Capt. Marshall, who was 34 years old, had participated in the recent inter-Allied conferences at Cairo as a member of the Planning Staff of the Army Air Forces and was making a tour of the war area in India, Burma and China when the accident occurred.

Captain Marshall was born in West Newton, Mass., and was graduated from Phillips Andover Academy in 1925 and from Yale University in 1930.

Before entering the Army he was active in relief work, and was a director of the Grace Church Workshop and the Bureau of Men and Boys of the Community Service Society. He also was head of the firm of Warner Marshall Jr., & Co., investment counselors, of 90 Broad Street. He was a member of the Yale Club in New York.

In 1940 he married Miss Nina Tandberg, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Norgen Johan Tandberg, of Oslo, Norway.

Surviving besides Capt. Marshall's wife and parents, are two brothers, the Rev. Malcolm Marshall, of St. Alban's Parish, National Episcopal Cathedral, Washington, and Private Gordan Marshall, of the United States Army.
